SASCOC's Mandate



National Sport and Recreation Act, 1998 (Act No.110 of 1998, as amended)

- Promote and develop high performance sport
- Act as a controlling body for the preparation and delivery of Team South African to multi-coded international games, including but not limited to Olympics, Paralympics, World Games, Commonwealth Games, All Africa Games.



SASCOC Mandate in the NSRP

SASCOC Governance

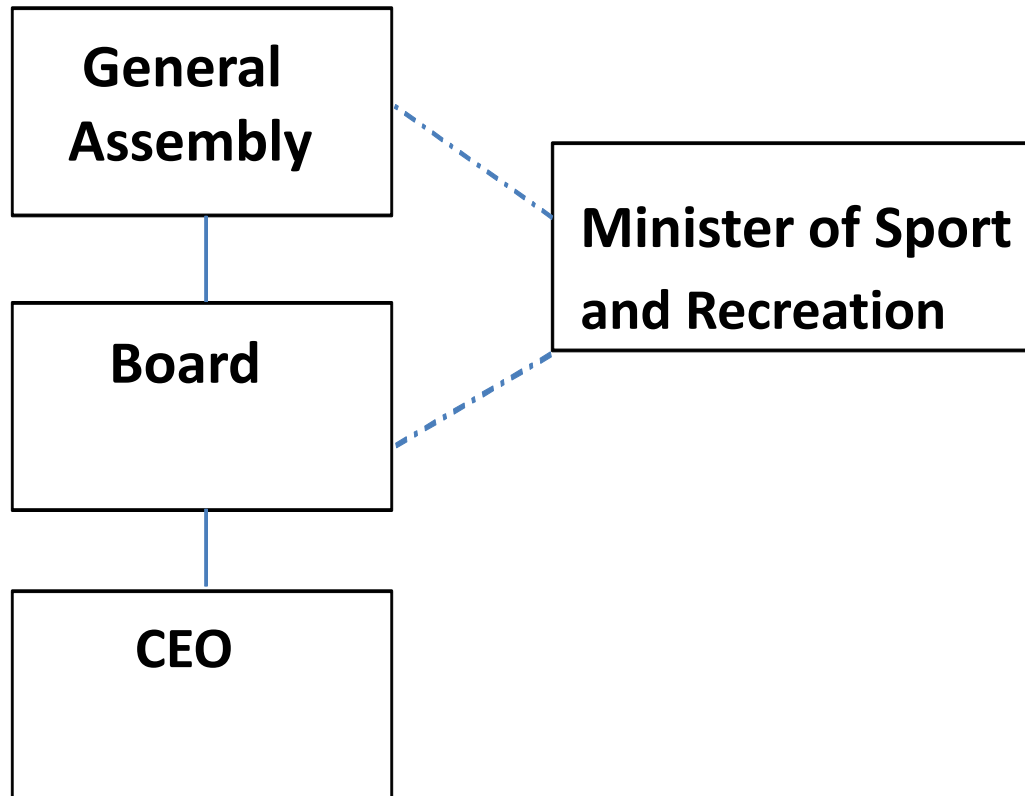


SASCOC is governed by:

Coach Developer Programme

- The implementation of the programme is being reviewed based on experiences and lessons learned from the pilot programme
 - Sourced funding from Olympic Solidarity to bring out an expert from Coaching Association of Canada
 - First session with National Coach Education Advisors (NCEAs), Lead Coaching Personnel from NFs, and Coach Developers was held in July 2017

SASCOC's Priorities



Master's Degree Programme

- 23 Coaches/ NCEAs/ National Coach Developers went through RPL for the Master's Degree
- The programme has not progressed due to funding. KZN province has committed to supporting its coaches and coach developers who were admitted onto the programme



SASCOC's Priorities



Professional Body for Sports Coaching

- SASCOC recognised by SAQA as a Professional Body for sport coaching
- Resolution of the General Assembly on 22 April 2017 was to keep the Professional Body within SASCOC
- Possible change of name – South African Sports Coaching Institute of Excellence (SASCIE)
- Legislation

Team Delivery

- World Games 2017 – 1 medal (Tug of War)
- Commonwealth Youth Games 2017 – 18 medals (5th on medal table)

- 2018 Winter Olympic Games - PyeongChang 9-25 February
 - 2018 Winter Paralympic Games – PyeongChang 9-18 March
 - 2018 Commonwealth Games 4-15 April

2018 Commonwealth Games

- 18 Sporting Codes (incl. 5 para sports)
 - Potential to participate in 16 Codes
 - Rugby 7's and netball qualification confirmed by the IFs
 - Para sports, Hockey, Beach Volleyball qualification end on 31 October 2017
 - Other codes – December 2017

2018 Commonwealth Games

- 4 January 2018 – Submission of final teams by NFs to SASCOC
 - 5-9 January 2018 - Verification of submissions
 - 10 January 2018 – HP Commission meeting
 - 12 – 19 January 2018 - Board Ratification process
 - 25 January 2018 – Team Announcement
 - 26 January 2018 – Code Managers Meeting
 - 20 March 2018 - 1st group depart for Pre Games Training Camp (PGTC)
 - 24 March 2018 – 2nd group depart for PGTC
 - 25-27 March 2018 – Pre Games Holding Gamp in Johannesburg

Finances

- Budget required for the quadrennial- full budget presented to Portfolio Committee in May 2017 - R595 700, 743
- For the 2017/2018 Financial Year - R 119 214, 500
- Allocation from SRSA for 2017/18 - R 9 813 000 (OPEX and Coaching Development)
