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REPORT OF THE PORTFOLIO COMMITTEE ON SPORT, ARTS AND CULTURE ON PROTECTION, PROMOTION, DEVELOPMENT AND MANAGEMENT OF INDIGENOUS KNOWLEDGE BILL [B6B – 2016]

1. INTRODUCTION

The Protection, Promotion, Development and Management of Indigenous Knowledge Bill was referred to the Limpopo Legislature by the National Council of Provinces (NCOP). Subsequently, Limpopo Legislature referred the above-mentioned Bill to the Portfolio Committee on Sport, Arts and Culture for consideration and confers of negotiating and final mandates to the NCOP Permanent Delegates on 13 June 2018 and 07 August 2018 respectively.


2. PURPOSE OF THE BILL

The objective of the Bill is to provide for the protection, promotion, development and management of indigenous knowledge; to provide for the establishment and functions of the National Indigenous Knowledge Systems office; to provide for the management of rights of indigenous knowledge communities; to provide for the establishment and functions of the Advisory Panel on indigenous knowledge; to provide for access and conditions of access of knowledge of indigenous communities; to provide for the recognition of prior learning; to provide for the facilitation and coordination of indigenous knowledge-based innovation; and to provide for matters incidental thereto.

In a meeting held on 07 August 2018, the Committee agreed that a final mandate should be conferred to the NCOP permanent delegate to vote in favour of the Bill.

The Committee received mainly oral inputs and comments on the Bill from stakeholders and public in all the 5 districts of the province and they all agreed with the provisions of the Bill.
