Mr M Manyi (EFF) to ask the Minister in The Presidency for Planning, Monitoring and Evaluation:

(a) How did her Office address systemic issues in underperforming government departments in the past five years to ensure sustainable improvements rather than short-term fixes and (b) what are the relevant details in this regard? **[NW638E]**

Reply:

- (a) In the past five years (2019-2024), the DPME Reports to the Executive on the sector performance have comprehensively reflected areas of success; limited progress; identified systemic issues that impaired progress with implementation and formulated remedial interventions to overcome such constraints, both in the short-to-medium term and in the long term.
- (b) Systemic monitoring and evaluation of government programmes by the DPME have led to the design and implementation of nation-wide government programmes, with a long-term view. These include amongst others, the National Food and Nutrition Security Plan 2018-2023 and the Local Government Management Improvement Model, which is aimed at providing an analytical

framework for organisational leadership to reflect on what the organisation does and how it approaches its tasks so as to improve the quality of service delivery and productivity.
